

SACRIFICE AGAINST A SURE THING

West deals and opens 1♠. Your partner overcalls 3♥. This is a “weak jump overcall.” It is similar to a 3-level pre-emptive opening. It shows 7 hearts and less than opening values. East responds with 4♥. This is a cue bid, confirming his partner’s spades and showing a good hand. Would you take any action here?

When I played this hand on iBridgePlus*, I took a flyer with 5♣. I thought it was safe, considering we had favorable vulnerability. I would have to be set by 4 tricks to compensate for their certain spade game. If we get doubled, I could run to 5♦.

Over my 5♣, West bid 5♥. This was also a cue bid telling her partner that her hand was good enough to make 5♠. My partner raised my bid 6♣. This was doubled by East and became the final contract.

West led the ♥A and I saw this dummy hand:

Rather than ruffing the initial lead, I discarded my spade loser. This might help me by not having to lose a trick in the middle of the play. Plus, there is always the chance that West will follow with the ♥K.

My plan was to set up the dummy's heart suit. In order to do this, I had to play my trump carefully since they are the only entries I had to the hearts.

West made a error in following with the ♥K. I ruffed the second heart and played the ♦A and another diamond. East won and played a spade, which I ruffed. Then I started pulling trump, ruffing out the missing hearts in the process. I led the ♠A and then a low club to the ♣10. Since I knew from East's discard on the 2nd heart, that West started with 5 hearts. I ruffed a low heart with the ♠K and led my ♣J to the dummy's ♣Q. Now I could clear the hearts with my ♥QJ.

The opponents took 1 heart and 1 diamond and I ended down 1 doubled for -100. They can easily make 5♠ for a net difference of 550 points.

This is the entire deal:
