

THINK BEFORE YOU SETTLE

East passes and you open 1♠ with this hand

South
 ♠ AK8543
 ♥ 4
 ♦ Q
 ♣ Q8652

Your partner responds 2♦ and you rebid your six card spade suit. He jumps to 3NT. What should you do?

Your partner's two over one response and his jump to 3NT shows a strong hand. But the prospects of a game in notrump are dim. You might be only able to contribute 2 tricks in notrump. Rather than make the thoughtless "pass" it would be better to show your second suit. If you rebid 4♣, your partner will be dissuaded from notrump and can take a preference of the two black suits.

Over your 4♣ he rebids 4NT. You fear that he is trying to insist on a notrump contract and is not bidding Blackwood. On the other hand, you know he doesn't know the extreme distribution that your hand holds. Say you ignore his desire and respond to a Blackwood invitation, showing 2 keycards, the Ace and King of trumps. He will rebid 5♠ to retrieve some sanity. Maybe you should pass him. Even if you miss the slam, most of the others playing this deal will probably be in 3NT and your score making 5♠ will be better.
